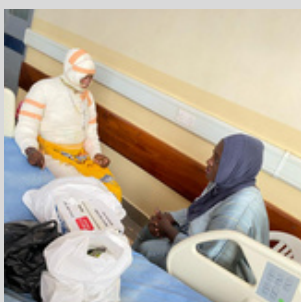

Medical and Nutritional support

CERESAV continued to stand by survivors by facilitating medical treatment and surgeries for those in need. Among them were Lillian Adiru, attacked by her co-wife in Lugazi District in March 2025, and Fred Mutagubya, assaulted by his ex-girlfriend in Mpigi District in November 2024. We also extended nutritional support to all our survivors, including Charles, who underwent surgery with CERESAV's support earlier this year in January.

As part of our commitment to survivor care, CERESAV continued hospital and home visits to check on victims' recovery and support their reintegration into their communities. Through these visits, we build trust and provide emotional support, creating a safe space for survivors to share their stories and take important steps in their healing journey.



In memory of John Odong

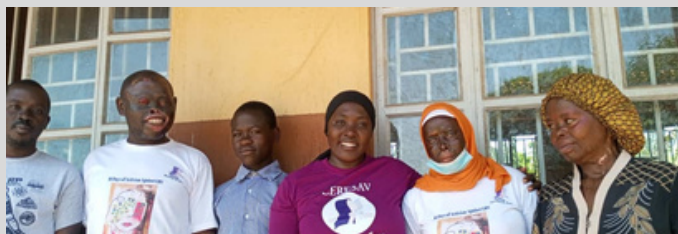


It is with great sadness that CERESAV announces the passing of John Adong, a 67-year-old burn victim. Unknown assailants poured petrol around and inside his home while he was at work. On returning and lighting a candle, the house caught fire, severely burning him. Although he escaped, his injuries were extensive.

After a month of care under CERESAV's support, John sadly passed away in February this year. We honor his courage and remain committed to supporting survivors and fighting for justice.

May he rest in peace

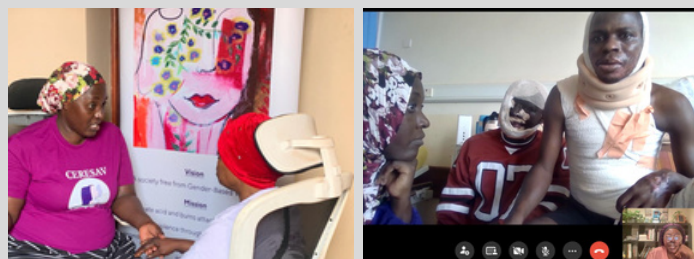

Education fund and verification Exercise

CERESAV proudly supported 21 children through our Education Fund by paying their school fees and conducting a detailed verification exercise across Uganda's East, West, North, and Central regions. Covering over 11 districts, the exercise aimed to ensure that children were properly enrolled in school, that tuition payments were accurately reflected, and to better understand the living conditions of both the children at school and their survivor parents at home. This effort helps us strengthen our support and plan more targeted interventions where needed.

Psycho-social Support



Together with Hanifa, we offered psychosocial support to Survivor Jamida as she navigated financial challenges to return her children to school, and to Survivor Fred during his healing journey. These moments of care and encouragement brought hope and strength, empowering them to recover quickly and continue building their lives with resilience.

Civil Society organizations Market



CERESAV took part in a vibrant CSO Market organized by the Network for Active Citizens. Our survivor-led initiatives generated about \$260. This amount was realized through the sales of woven baskets made by Survivor Jamida. The sales helped return her children to school, marking a powerful step towards rebuilding their future. A portion was also given to Survivor Margret for her role in assisting Jamida with the sales.
